ABOUT

The Giving Project is an innovative program for leadership development and social justice philanthropy. Over 6 months, we work closely with a diverse group of 25 people from all income levels who are passionate about social justice and want to strengthen their skills in **fundraising, grantmaking, and grassroots organizing**. They develop a shared analysis of race, class, and power within society, make a personal donation of an amount that is meaningful to them, then collectively raise and grant money to grassroots organizations working for social change in Colorado.

WE BUILD MOVEMENTS

Since 2016, our Giving Project has

- trained 92 donor organizers
- engaged over 900 new donors and supporters
- funded 46 community-led organizations

Giving Projects have been especially successful at reaching traditionally underrepresented communities, including young people and people of color, in Colorado and throughout the US. Constituent-Led

The work is led by the people most impacted by injustice. Unlike a traditional charity model, we believe that those most affected by the issue have the vision and solutions for their own liberation – and that the development of their leadership, skills, and power should be prioritized.

Community-Wide

The work reflects all members of the constituency, especially those who experience multiple forms of oppression. This ensures that change for the community leaves no one behind, especially for those who have less privilege within the community.

Lasting Effect

The work makes change not just for one individual today, but for the community as a whole, and for future generations. Generally this means organizing collective action to change systems and institutions.

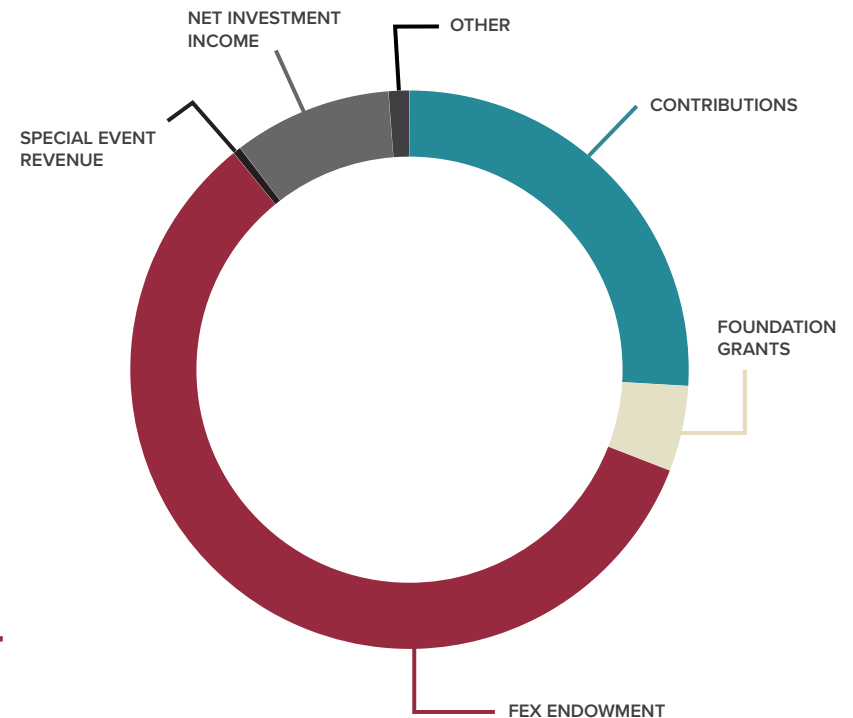

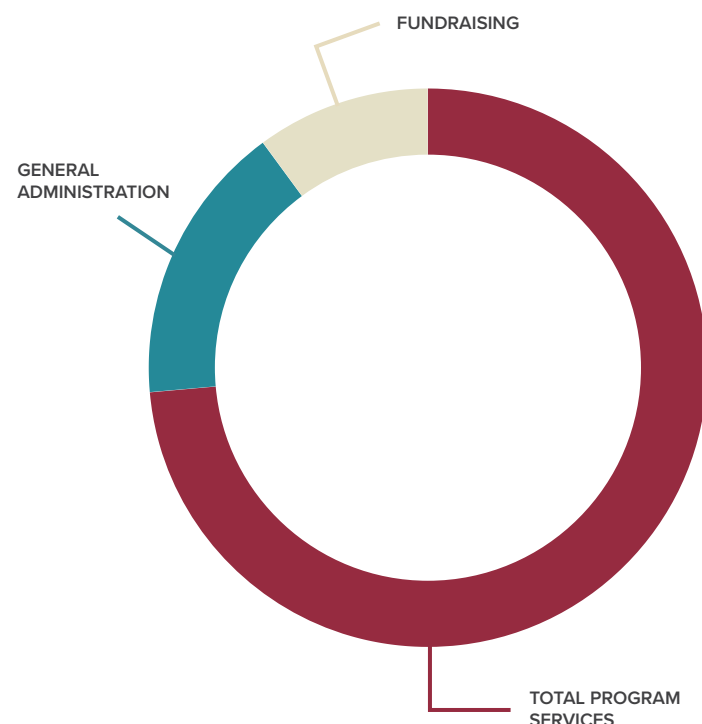
